

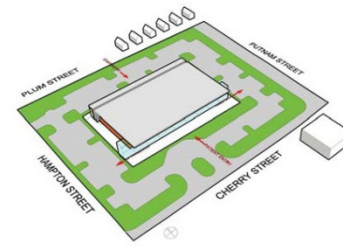
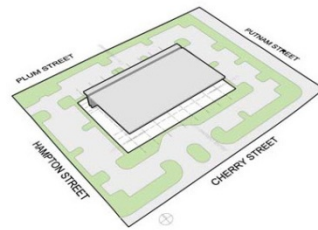
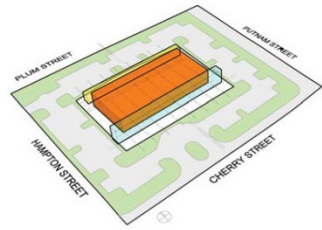
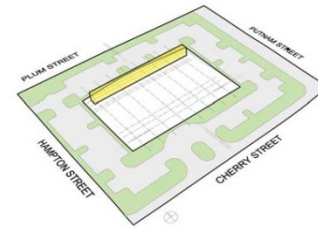
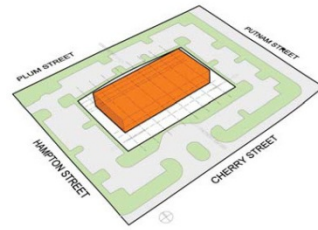
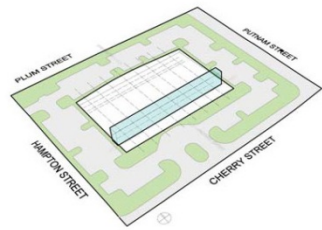
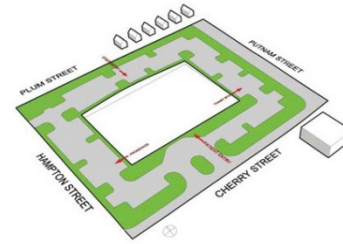
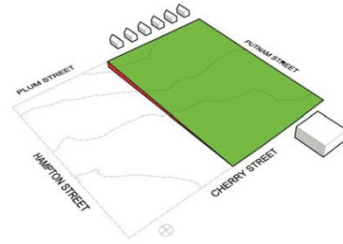
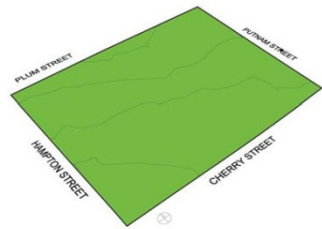
## FIRST FLOOR PLAN

The building organizes from south to north by distributing the program in zones that run the length of the structure. Beginning with the public entry and reception in a grand, brightly lit, glass hall, patrons then move into the central clinical areas of the building, while staffing and support spaces occupy the northernmost zone. From east to west the building divides into several different clinics that are interconnected to offer future versatility.



## SITE PLAN

Situated at the edge of Jackson Hospital's Montgomery, Alabama Campus, the building adapts to a context of multiple scales and typologies. To the south lies large institutional buildings of the medical campus, and to the north sits early twentieth century homes of the Capitol Heights neighborhood.



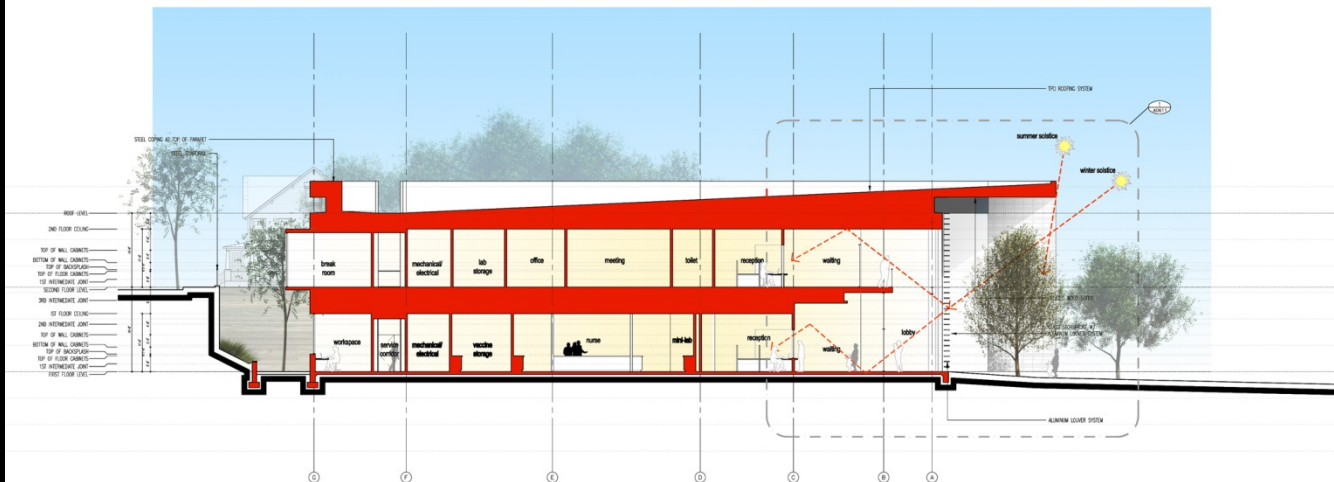
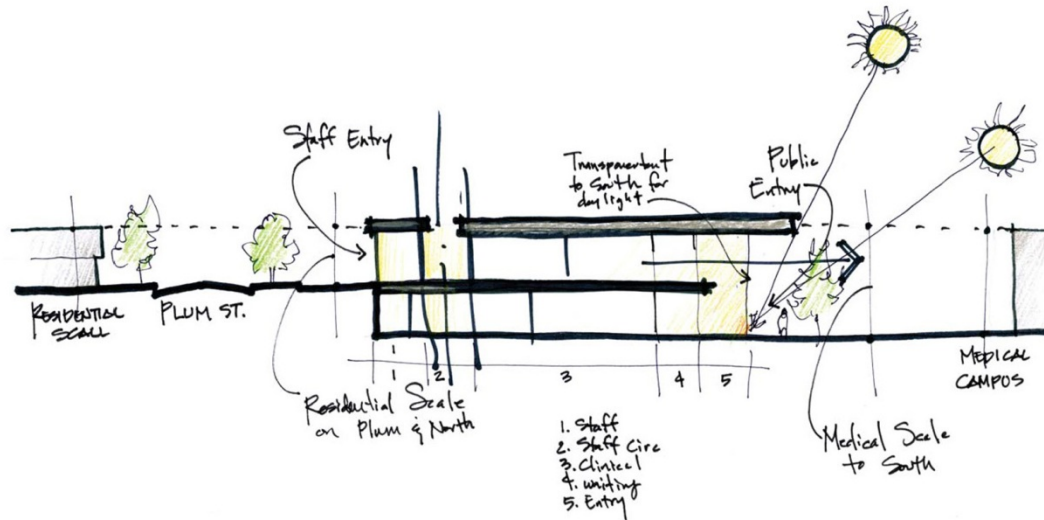

Transparency allows day lighting to penetrate into the clinical areas of the building.





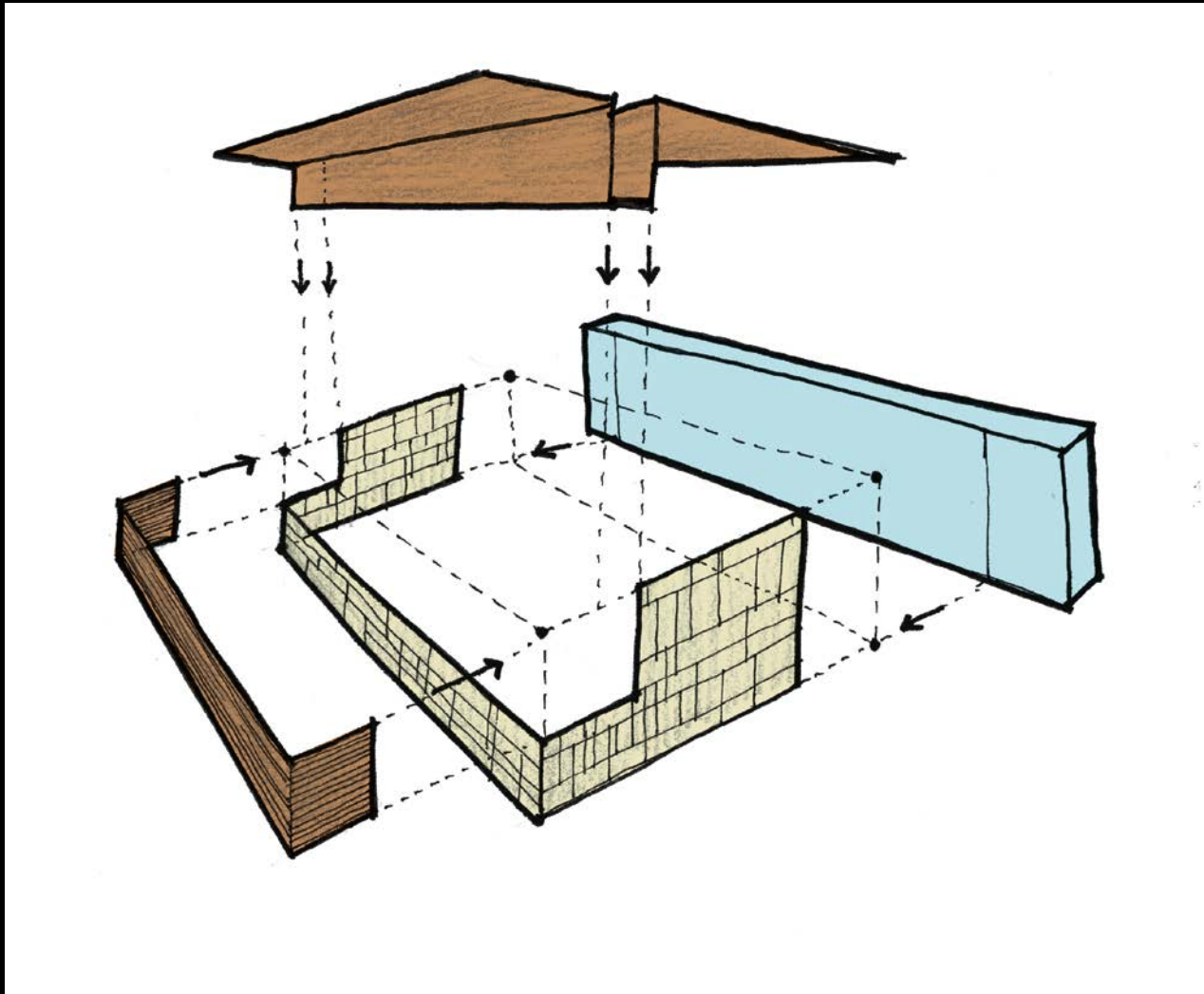
## NORTH EAST CORNER
